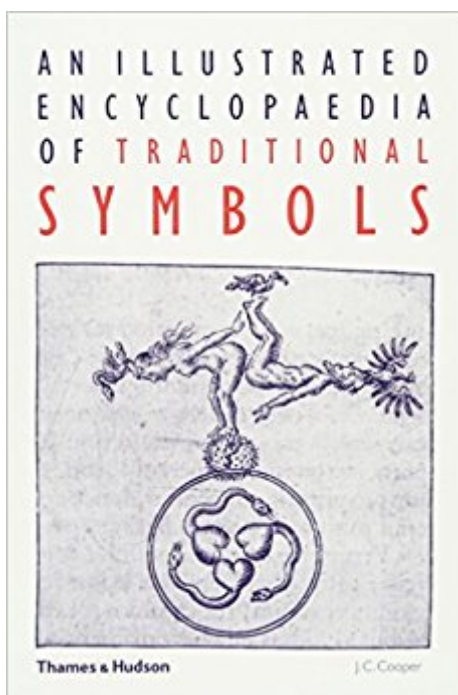

Jean C. Cooper (1905-1999) was born in China where she spent much of her childhood. Informed by the perspective of the Perennial Philosophy, she wrote and lectured extensively on the subjects of philosophy, comparative religion, and symbolism. Her other books include Taoism, the Way of the Mystic, Yin and Yang, Chinese Alchemy, Fairy Tales: Allegories of the Inner Life, Symbolism, the Universal Language, and Symbolic and Mythological Animals.

This book would be a good addition to any reference library, but calling this an illustrated encyclopedia of symbols is a bit of a stretch. The title would suggest that an illustration would be present for every entry and this simply is not true. The book is very good quality, but if you are hoping to skip through pages of illustrations to identify something you have no name or title for, this book will fall short. This is for someone who already knows what the symbol looks like and what it is

called, not someone trying to identify symbols.

Book becomes very unpleasant on Kindle and it is very hard to read since you need to go from one page to see the symbol and go back to read about it and its details. Book is nice in other terms and is nice to use and read about the history and signs and so on but as said not on Kindle.
