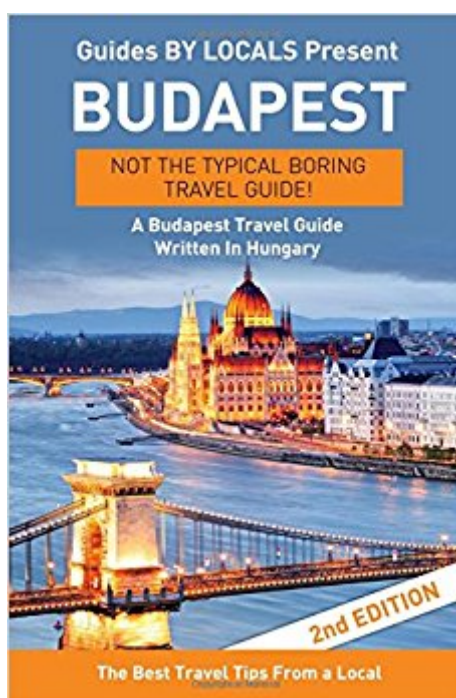


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Budapest: By Locals - A Budapest Travel Guide Written In Hungary: The Best Travel Tips About Where To Go And What To See In Budapest, Hungary
