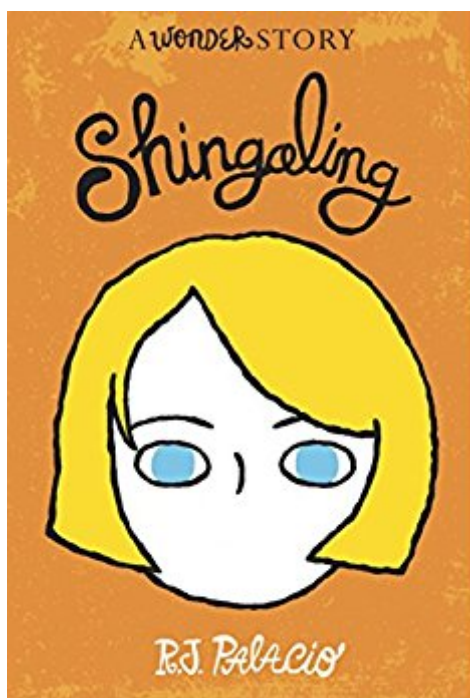

His books give a voice to those thoughts which go on in all of your heads and the accompanying emotions which go along with it. His books address bullying, compassion, friendship and real love. My daughter also loves his other book which is full of inspirational quotes.

I love Ms. Palacio's work. I fell in love with Wonder, then Julian's Chapter. Now this one. I love how she puts realistic emotions in her characters. Reading this book is like living the lives of the young people who are narrating. They are real and full of emotion. Reading these books is effortless for me. I started and before I knew it, I was finished.

Remember middle school? Welcome back to that perplexing intensity, the beginnings of moral ambiguity, and an annoying feeling that you just are not good enough. This book brought me right back there. Palacio's writing is clear and yet deceptively complex: the characters feel real and their layered situations ring true. It is a fast read for adults, but one that can help us remember that life in puberty is both joyful and difficult and those in the middle of it deserve our patience, attention and respect.
