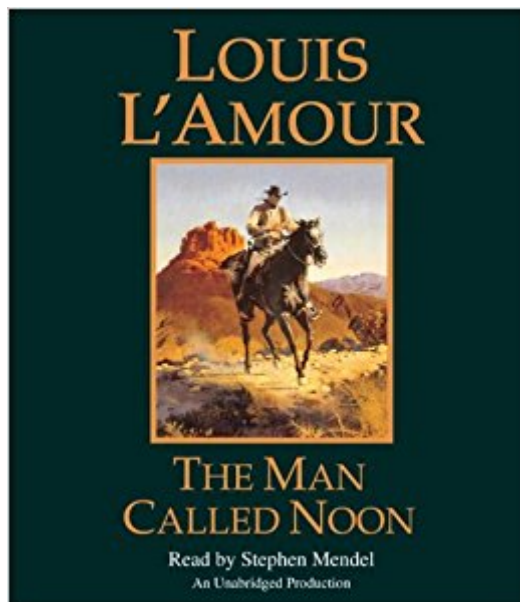

Louis L'Amour is the only novelist in history to receive both the Presidential Medal of Freedom and the Congressional Gold Medal. He has published ninety novels; twenty-seven short-story collections; two works of nonfiction; a memoir, *Education of a Wandering Man*; and a

volume of poetry, *Smoke from This Altar*. There are more than 300 million copies of his books in print.

It's been 30+ years since I first read this book and for that matter every book that Louis L'Amour ever penned that I could lay my hands on. I am well read on many subjects by many skilled writers, though Louis never failed to deliver like so many others so. This book is fast, thrilling and the plot not so easily garnered. To be fair, time has done much to erase much of the content of the story in this book and it was read quite addictively. I can devour any book Louis L'Amour and this one was no exception. I guess what I like most about Louis's style is that it is detailed just enough to place me in the exact time and place as he intended, but fluid enough to keep the story line constantly moving. I can only imagine what it would be like losing one's memory, knowing that many want to kill you; not knowing who or why. This is a classic Louis L'Amour western and like any other could have used a sequel or perhaps even a series.....
