

Synopsis

You-are-there stories of ambushes and patrols on the Mekong in the Vietnam War Developed specifically for the Vietnam War (and made famous by the 2004 presidential campaign), Swift Boats were versatile craft Å“big enough to outrun anything they couldnÅ“t outfightÅ“ but too small to handle even a moderate ocean chop, too loud to sneak up on anyone, and too flimsy to withstand the mildest of rocket attacks. This made more difficult an already tough mission: navigating coastal waters for ships and sampans smuggling contraband to the Viet Cong, disrupting enemy supply lines on the rivers and canals of the Mekong Delta, and inserting SEALs behind enemy lines. The stories in this book cover the Swift BoatsÅ“ early years, which saw search-and-inspect operations in VietnamÅ“s coastal waters, and their later years, when the Swift BoatsÅ“ mission shifted to the Mekong DeltaÅ“s labyrinth of 3,000 miles of rivers, streams, and canals. This is an intimate, exciting oral history of Swift Boats at war in Vietnam.

Having served on Swifts in 1970 as an OinC, the book brought back a flood of memories. Some good, some not so good, but all part of my tour. I recognized most of the places (Seafloat, Ha Tien, Coastal Divisions 11 and 13) and was there at most of them. John & Guy did a great job putting together these incidents as told by the guys who lived them. If you want to know what it was like for us "Swifites", this is the book!

An outstanding read! I served on these boats in Vietnam. This collection of personal stories and experiences in a very dangerous combat environment does an excellent job of describing what a tour of duty was really like on these boats. I think the individual contributors and editors have done an excellent job in telling the story with facts and personal, first hand experience. I highly recommend reading this book.

I found this book because a buddy of mine mentioned his step dad was in it. Turns out he is chapter one about trying to take a crap off the back of a 50' boat in deep, rolling seas. Each chapter is written by somebody that served on the Swift Boats and you get a great feeling from multiple angles what it was like to serve in Vietnam in a Swift Boat.

This is real life stuff written by the officers and sailors who served aboard the U.S. Navy's 50-foot Swift Boats in Vietnam's rivers and canals. This is not a piece of historical fiction. These are personal short stories of what war and life was like for any one of the six crewmembers of these thin aluminum-skinned, high-speed war machines. Guy Gugliotta and John Yeoman, each of whom earned three Bronze Stars as Officer-in-Charge of their own Swifts based out of An Thoi Vietnam, have collected a terrific assortment of wartime accounts that make up this book. Open the book on any page and it will immediately grab you and keep you reading. I served with Guy and John over there in 1970 and applaud their efforts, along with Neva Sullaway of San Diego's Maritime Museum, to pull together this book of heroism, humor, and heartbreak.
