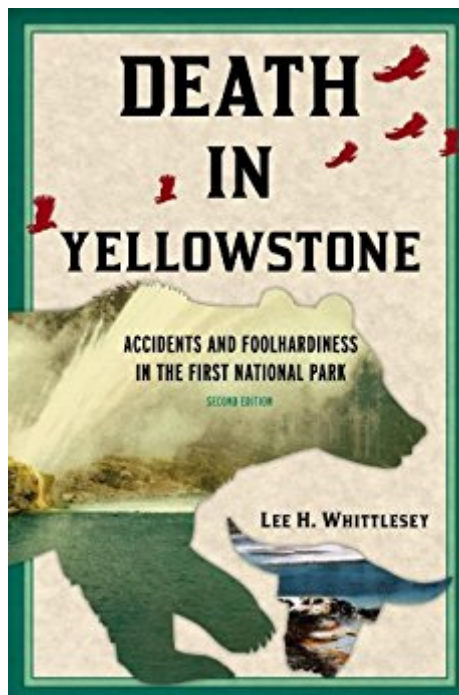


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Death In Yellowstone: Accidents And Foolhardiness In The First National Park

If you're one of the disciples of Yellowstone, you'll find this book very interesting. I've visited there only twice but I'm in total love with the place and its animal inhabitants. The photographic opportunities are what drew me to the park, and now its magnetism is irresistible. Having viewed it's

deep canyons, steaming geysers, boiling mud pits and craggy mountains, I already had a healthy respect for the inherent dangers of the place. After reading this book, it instills more clearly that one risks life and limb by entering one of the last wild havens for free roaming animals. Especially those who are so blinded by its beauty that they're lulled into a false sense of security. From people falling into steaming geyser pools, being attacked and possibly eaten by grizzlies, freezing to death in the harsh winters or tumbling into deep canyons, it recounts the stories of those who lost their lives in this beautiful wilderness. I found this book intriguing -- it's a well chronicled documentary of disaster in the park from the 1800's to present day.

I first read *Death in the Grand Canyon*, which was actually written after this book, and I really liked it. This book is really interesting with a lot of the history of deaths in and around Yellowstone. I think it could have been a quicker read if he hadn't included quite so much stuff that was so long ago and occurred outside the park. If someone was murdered a few miles outside of the park in 1860 it is not very relevant to me going to visit the park today. I like to read these so I know what to look out for if I go to the park today. It has added to my interest in the park which I know I need to go to.

Covering over 300 deaths since the 1800s, *Death in Yellowstone* ranges from drownings to bear maulings to burns in hot springs to murders to Native American attacks to poisonous plants to carbon monoxide to runaway coaches. Sometimes it jumps 100 years and then goes back. Sometimes the information about what happened is sparse and sometimes it's well documented. All of it adds up to one simple warning: Follow the rules and you will probably stay safe in that particular National Park. Climb over a barrier or try to take a picture with a bear and you may not come out alive.

Great book that gives a factual account of the ways that people have lost their lives at Yellowstone. The author clearly spent an immense amount of time researching, and gives us information without tabloid dramatics. Events are described in detail and some are not for the weak hearted, but the interesting take-away for me is that most who died were either ill-prepared, violated park rules, or were simply not aware of the power of nature in such a wilderness area. I found it interesting for the history and descriptions of the areas. The deaths were sad, of course, yet some of them left me scratching my head at the decisions people made which cost their lives. Even so, that too was sad, but reading this book made me feel incredible respect for this beautiful part of North America, which is both beautiful and dangerous.

Compared to more statistically researched and better written works like "Death Below the Rim," this book provides a sometime jumbled, inconclusive portrayal of the long history of death and murder in Yellowstone.

If you have ever been to Yellowstone, this is MUST read! You will be blown away by what has happened in such a marvelous, but dangerous place!! Makes you appreciate the forces of nature and how foolish man can be!

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
