

A very easy read, this book would work wonderfully for any high school anthropology class. Furthermore, its detailed handling of the subject would also make it helpful in collegiate level introductory courses. It has weaknesses in chapter organization, and the authors can lapse into a rather "Sunday school" tone when they attempt to tie Christianity into anthropology (which they do sufficiently), often seeming to over stress/over teach rather simple concepts. Nevertheless, overall, this is an excellent text.
